ASSOCIATION OF JEWISH REFUGEES RECEPTION AT THE WIENER LIBRARY

Members of the Association of Jewish Refugees (AJR) from across the country gathered at the Wiener Library on Wednesday 28 March for a special reception with H.E. the Ambassador of Israel, Daniel Taub.

The reception was part of the three-day visit to London by AJR members who also visited the Westminster Synagogue to see the Czech scrolls and *Signin' in the Rain* at The Palace Theatre. Prior to the reception at the Wiener Library, AJR members heard from Michael Caplan QC at the Royal Courts of Justice and had a behind the scenes tour of Harrods followed by Afternoon Tea. The three-day trip concluded with a tour of the East End of London and lunch at Rinkoff's bakery.

Addressing guests at the reception, AJR Chairman, Andrew Kaufman, will say: "As well as our members from London, I want to give a special mention to those of you who have travelled – in some cases some fairly lengthy distances from Nottingham, Birmingham, Liverpool, Leeds, Manchester and Glasgow.

The London trip is now a well established fixture in our calendar of events and as well as giving members who know each other, but who live in different parts of the country, the chance to reconnect, it is also an opportunity to make new acquaintances. This is the philosophy that lies behind the outreach programme; to give you the opportunity to enjoy these unique social opportunities.
