Meanwhile, as a business, X relies on our content to keep its users engaged. More engagement means more advertising revenue. Simply put, X profits from our presence there – it profits from each word we post.

We say NOT ONE MORE WORD.

It's time to stop posting. We will silence our accounts as of 13 December 2024. And we pledge to support our valued colleagues who join in this effort by promoting each other's content however possible.
